Micro-Credentials

A micro-credential is a certification indicating demonstrated competency in a specific skill. Professionals take courses/trainings and develop these skills in certain fields. They promote learning by doing: professionals apply their learnings in practice, collect evidence, and demonstrate their competence.

L.E.A.D. (LEADERSHIP, EXPLORATION, AND DEVELOPMENT)

L.E.A.D. 1.0: Leadership and quality in afterschool programs are inseparable; for programs to succeed and become sustainable, they need strong leadership at all levels. This four-part series will provide an advanced level group of afterschool professionals with the tools to hone their strengths and develop new skills to assume greater leadership roles in the future. Specifically designed for experienced directors and site coordinators who are looking for that next level of growth and development. Each session will include a training session, a guest speaker, lunch and time to network.

HELPING THEM TO LEAD THE WAY

Do you want to support a group of youth to create change in their lives? Helping Them to Lead the Way is a 5-part workshop series on the knowledge-base and skill sets for raising up youth voices and supporting them to create the change they see is needed in their lives, schools, and communities. From individual self-advocacy to empowering community level youth leadership, this series walks participants through an Empowerment Model for creating youth-led change, while supporting them in creating their own youth leadership development plan.

This series will provide participants with knowledge of adolescent development, leadership, and relationship content relevant to each phase of the empowerment model, and will present key principles and activities of youth empowerment, while supporting participants to develop their own youth leadership goal and a plan to achieve that goal. Culminating in the presentation of participants' youth empowerment project plans and the design of an evaluation of their effectiveness from the youths' perspective, this series provides the content and experiences for developing and planning a youth-led change initiative in partnership with youth and empowering their leadership development as change-makers.

SEL MICRO-CREDENTIAL

Foundations and Applications of SEL

Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) has taken schools, communities, and parents/caregivers by storm over the past few years with great reason: SEL supports academic achievement, improves student well-being, builds skills that are key to future readiness, and improves school climate and safety. This is an introductory level 7-part, 18-hour professional development series for school-based afterschool professionals who are seeking a more expansive lens of the SEL core competencies and a greater understanding of how to apply these principles to your own work.

- Understand and effectively apply the five core competencies of social emotional learning identified by the Collaborative for Academic and Social Emotional Learning (CASEL).
- Practice peer facilitation and connect each of the five core competencies to key settings in your community

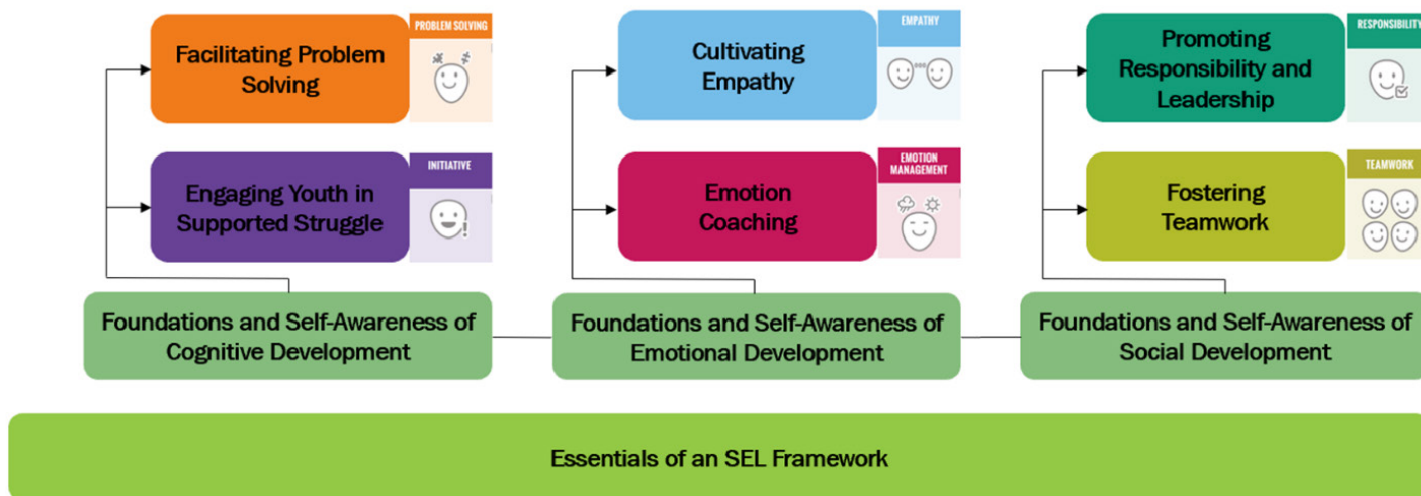

Career Pathways

AFTERSCHOOL ESSENTIALS

Afterschool Essentials is an accelerated half-year program that Vermont Afterschool offers FREE for staff working in licensed afterschool and child care programs. It is designed to meet the needs of the professional with limited experience in the afterschool setting. This program covers a full range of topics, including school-age child development, program development, health and safety issues, and partnerships with families, inclusion and cultural diversity.

For Fall 2025, the program content will include five meetings with the cohort, 11 online learning modules with the Youth Development Institute, self-study, and consultation with a coach.

NOTE: Those who complete the full course will also be eligible for the Afterschool Foundations Certificate and a **\$300 bonus from CDD**.

Afterschool and Youth Work Certificate

Offered by the Community College of Vermont (CCV), the Afterschool and Youth Work Certificate will provide students with essential skills to develop, support, and administer high-quality afterschool and youth programs for young people ages 5–18. Emphasis is on developing programs that use youth voice, active learning, planning and reflection, and supporting effective collaboration with families and community partners. The coursework can be completed fully online for a total of 24 credits. **The 3 FREE online CCV courses listed on p. 11 can be applied to this Certificate.**

Participants who successfully complete the Certificate are **eligible to receive a \$1,000 bonus.**

Vermont Afterschool Foundations Certificate

Designed to support and recognize the professional development of Vermont's entry-level afterschool professionals during the first two years of employment.

Vermont Afterschool Professional Credential

The Credential is a way to formally recognize the professional competency and accomplishments of afterschool professionals who demonstrate a depth of experience and training.

The Certificate and Credential are connected to the Vermont Core Competencies for Afterschool Professionals. The application process for the Credential requires applicants to document learning in each of the following 10 core knowledge areas:

1. Child/Youth Growth and Development
2. Learning Environments and Curriculum
3. Child/Youth Observations and Assessment
4. Relationships and Interactions with Children and Youth
5. Youth Engagement, Voice, and Choice
6. Equity and Inclusion
7. Family, School, and Community Relationships
8. Safety and Wellness
9. Program Planning and Development
10. Professional Development and Leadership

Youth Resilience Trainings

BASIC SPECIALIZED CARE

This six-hour introductory training for early childhood and afterschool professionals who serve vulnerable children and their families in regulated child care and afterschool settings is one of the requirements to become a Specialized Care Provider in Vermont. Topics covered include caregiving together with families; child abuse, neglect, and trauma; understanding differences in development; and understanding children's behavior.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

Youth Mental Health First Aid USA teaches you how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders in youth. This training gives adults who work with youth the skills they need to reach out and provide initial support to children and adolescents (ages 12-18) who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem and help connect them to the appropriate care. This training includes 2 hours of required pre-work and 5 hours of instructor-led content.

Instead of a sole focus on limiting risk factors or maintaining a problem-free environment, Youth Thrive teaches youth work professionals and parents to recognize, support, and build on protective and promotive factors. Based in strengths-based and positive psychology, this approach can be used in any setting where youth and families are served.

YOUTH THRIVE 4 YOUTH

Developed by the Center for the Study of Social Policy, Youth Thrive is a Framework and a national initiative that promotes improvements in youth-serving systems and better access to supports, resources, and opportunities for all young people to thrive. The Framework is based on a review of research on adolescent development, brain science, trauma, resilience, and healing. At the heart of the Youth Thrive Framework are five protective and promotive factors that are key to well-being for all youth (age 9–26) as they grow into young adults. This 8-hour training (2 hours virtual, 6 hours in person) is available for a cohort of youth in your program ages 14–22 who are invested in understanding what they and their peers are going through during adolescence and learning how to promote their own healing, health, and well-being.

FLOURISH LAB: SEL MICRO-TRAININGS

Vermont Afterschool is pleased to be able to offer SEL micro-trainings created by The Flourish Lab in Denver, CO. Known for being relevant, easy to implement, and right to the point, what's learned in these workshops can be used in your program as soon as the following day.

September 10, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: Acknowledging & Validating | Virtual

Feeling seen and acknowledged by adults is vital to children's positive development. When young people feel valued and respected, they're more likely to trust, which deepens any exchange. We'll explore the empowering skills of acknowledgement and validation (along with their opposites), examining the potential impact of each.

September 22, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: Belonging | Virtual

It is human and deeply rooted in us all to want to belong. Not surprisingly then, when we first step into a new group, it is our differences that often bubble to the surface, sometimes manifesting difficult emotions and behaviors. Spotting this kind of pattern is part of how we show up fully for our students—as we support them with new vantage points that see, embrace and celebrate differences.

October 14, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: Bias Introduction | Virtual

You can't change what you don't acknowledge. And yet, it's virtually impossible to show up as ourselves without bringing our personal blind spots to the table. Once we see and name our biases, we can change them. With new awareness, equity enters the forefront, allowing us to intentionally show up as our best for all students. This workshop dips a toe into a timely human topic that fundamentally changes every conversation and our part in it.

October 27, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: De-Escalation | Virtual

Children, like adults, have emotional emergencies—they just look different from ours. But there's a predictable pattern to escalation that, if caught in time, can re-direct outcomes from explosive to calm. Using a child-first, relationship-centered mindset, this module teaches us that strong behaviors are no mystery, and that all feelings make sense. We also discover that preventative techniques can help facilitate a sense of calm.

FLOURISH LAB: SEL MICRO-TRAININGS (cont.)

November 3, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: Empathy for Others | Virtual

Joy, pain, struggle, fear—empathy is about companioning someone in their experience, as-is—without trying to make it better, go away, or change it. And that takes practice. In this social and emotional development workshop, you'll be asked to experience empathy, explore what defines it, and learn how to create an empathy-infused space for the young people you work with.

November 19, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: Empathy for Self | Virtual

When we're at our best, the sun shines brighter and there's a bounce in our step. We also have moments that feel the opposite. To address the ups and downs of life and work, we'll explore inner critics, self-compassion and how to practice empathy for yourself so that you can be ready to lavish it on the children you serve.

December 3, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: Leadership with Adults | Virtual

We're here to debunk the notion of what leadership looks like. We define an ideal leader as YOU AT YOUR ABSOLUTE BEST, whatever that looks like, and growing from there. Leadership is a process, not a destination. We'll help identify and celebrate your unique blend of strengths and explore how to use them with intentionality.

December 8, 2025 (5:00 PM–5:45 PM) | Topic: Leadership with Youth | Virtual

Encouraging youth to step into leadership roles leads to noteworthy gains in social and emotional skills. Once we acknowledge that children are born leaders, all that remains is to spot the opportunities in plain sight, pass the baton, and step out of the way! We'll discuss the magic children can bring to any table when given the chance.

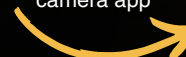
